#### \*\*NEW\*\* STUDENT ADVISING PROFILE ON BANNER WEB:

We are excited to announce that the NEW STUDENT ADVISING PROFILE is available for student use. We hope you will begin to use this as a new landing page in Banner web to locate a variety of information:

- Student name, photo and Twolves email
- Basic biographic and demographic information (email, phone, date of birth, emergency contact)
- General information (academic standing, student classification, first/last term attended)
- Graduation Information
- Major/Secondary Major
- Class schedule ("Registered Courses" only includes active registrations)
- Prior education and testing details (including institutions attended) and test scores
- Overall earned hours and GPA
- Registration Notices (things that impact your ability to register for courses)
- Holds (includes a detailed description of any holds on the account)
- Links to other important information such as the academic transcript, student schedule, graduation application, college catalog and Degree Works

Students can find this in two areas titled NEW - Student Profile. On the Registration tab, it is just above Academic Advisor Information. On the Student Records tab, it is at the bottom of the menu.

## **Degree Works Upgrade:**

Continuing students may have noticed that Degree Works underwent an upgrade over the summer. This version includes a significant update to the look and feel of Degree Works. While look and navigation have been updated to be responsive (mobile-friendly) and accessible, most

features and functions remain the same. New students should make themselves familiar with Degree Works to track their overall progress toward degree completion, and to view the Student Educational Plan/SEP that will outline recommended courses to take by semester. Degree Works is an online tool that will help you monitor your progress toward completion of a degree or certificate, reviewing all courses in progress or in history including any transferred courses brought in, to see where they fit within your major. It will also indicate any courses not used. This should be utilized anytime you make registration changes.

## **Dropping Courses:**

The last day to DROP a Fall 2021 course without it appearing on your transcript/schedule is **Sunday**, **September 19**. Students have the following options to drop a course on or before September 19:

- 1. Drop online in Banner Web: <u>Click here</u> for detailed instructions (*This option will no longer be available for Fall classes starting September 20*).
- 2. Complete the Drop or Withdraw from a Course Request Form.
- 3. Contact the Enrollment Center from your T-Wolves email at <a href="mailto:records@niagaracc.suny.edu">records@niagaracc.suny.edu</a>. The email MUST come from your T-Wolves email account.

Starting September 20, students have the following options available to WITHDRAW from a class:

- 1. Complete the <u>Drop or Withdraw from a Course Request Form.</u>
- 2. Contact the Enrollment Center from your T-Wolves email at <a href="mailto:records@niagaracc.suny.edu">records@niagaracc.suny.edu</a>. The email MUST come from your T-Wolves email account.

If you choose to withdraw from a course after September 19<sup>th</sup>, the course will remain on your transcript and a "W" grade will be assigned.
