As Michael Stipe of R.E.M. might have asked, "It's the end of the world as we know it. How does that make you feel?" Join us for diverse responses to the collapse of civilization in this co-curricular film series.

The Babushkas of Chernobyl

(Directed by Anne Bogart and Holly Morris, 2015)

Thursday, September 30, 1-3, in E-102 | Hosted by Jean Linn

In 1986, a nuclear reactor blew up in Chernobyl, Ukraine. Today Chernobyl is still one of the most contaminated places on Earth. This film follows three grandmothers who have illegally moved back to their ancestral homes though the government has declared the area an "exclusion zone." For most of the world, Chernobyl is a place to avoid. How are these women surviving in such a lonely, toxic place? This is a true story of life post-apocalypse.

The Road

(Directed by John Hillcoat, 2009)

Thursday, October 21, 1:45-4, in E-142 | Hosted by Ian Stapley

A short time after something has caused civilization to collapse, the survivors have become nomadic. The vagueness about the cause, timeline, and survivors of this collapse makes the relentlessly bleak and dispiriting depiction of daily life all the more vivid. A single can of Coca-Cola sparks joyful nostalgia in a world where no organizations exist to establish order or to offer protection from roving bands of cannibals. Amid all the darkness, there is a little fire, a small source of light, the love between father and son. That light creates a place for the audience to reflect on a significant issue: the very nature of civilization. What is its basis? What holds it together? What does it make possible? What is our individual responsibility in carrying it forward?

Night of the Living Dead

(Directed by George Romero, 1968)

Friday, October 29, 12-2:30, in E-202 and via Zoom | Hosted by Scott Sackett

Have you wondered why so many horror film characters make really bad choices? Bad decision-making in nightmare scenarios isn't just a cheap storytelling device. The truth is, many people make really bad decisions in life-threatening situations. Let's get together for a Halloween discussion and screening of the classic zombie apocalypse film *Night of the Living Dead*. We'll consider what can happen when a catastrophe causes a breakdown in social order and the prevailing psychological explanation of why 75% of people become incapable of rational thought and action in real-life emergency situations, why 10% freak out and endanger everyone else, and what you can do to put yourself in the 15% category of survivors. **Scott Sackett's presentation is open to the public.** Contact ssackett@niagaracc.suny.edu before October 29 for Zoom link.

Human beings have been herded into domed cities to survive a catastrophe, but, hey, that's no reason to cut the party short, right? Into this disco paradise--where everyone is young and beautiful, and technology has made hooking up more convenient than ever--a creeping doubt surfaces: what if the basis for this perfect society is false? What if there is a freer, better way to live? When the hero's ideal present is stolen from him, he must join forces with the heroine to save everyone's future. Join us as we compare notes on what we might really need and want for human society after the big one hits. Many others, despite the physical and psychological challenges her outdoors odyssey entails, she finds herself healing on the trail in this film directed by Jean-Marc Vallée.
