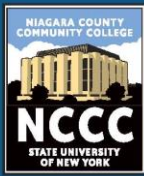

Against the riot of fascism in Italy and the Nazis' final solution, Guido (Roberto Benigni) arrives in the Italian town of Fiume in the 1930s and falls in love with the beautiful Jewish doctor's daughter, Tessa. Guido uses his charm, wit, and humor to win her over from an unscrupulously handsome SS officer. Your inner Guido again uses his colorful and humorous ingenuity to win over the dark forces of fascism as he fights to keep himself and his family safe in a time of war and persecution. Co-written and directed by Roberto Benigni, *Life is Beautiful* (1996) became the highest-grossing Italian film and received Academy Awards for Best Foreign Language Film and Best Actor.
