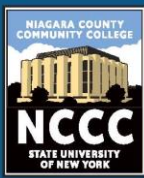

If you earned \$73,000 or less in 2021, you qualify for free tax prep and filing with the NYS Tax Department. NCCC Lewis Library is facilitating this remote tax help for faculty, staff, students, alumni, and the WNY community.

You will work with a NYS Tax Department employee to walk you through your income tax returns and filing.
