IMPORTANT Mask Mandate:

Effective February 28, 2022 the campus mask mandate for all will be as follows:

- The mandatory masking policy for those who are fully compliant with the vaccine mandate (as defined by the CDC, NYS, SUNY and the Niagara County Department of Health) will be lifted. While not required it is **encouraged** that masks be worn in areas of close proximity. **The current guidance defines fully vaccinated as those individuals who have received their initial dose or doses, and when eligible, have received the booster.**
- Those who are **not fully vaccinated** or have a religious or medical exemptions will be required to **continue to wear a mask at all times while on campus per SUNY revised policy as of 2.23.22.**
- Students who reside in housing will be required to continue to wear masks in the public areas of the Student Housing Village (hallways, laundry room, great room, café, etc.)
- All those who are not fully vaccinated **will be required** to continue to pool test weekly.
- The College **will continue** to randomly select students each week out of those who are fully vaccinated to participate in additional pool testing.
- NFCI students who are taking classes in the Savor restaurant or the LA Patisserie bakery **will continue** to be required to be tested weekly.
- Pool testing **will still** be available for all those if they wish to continue to test weekly. All costs are covered in full by the campus.

The College has not taken this decision lightly and has worked with both SUNY and the Niagara County Department of Health on ensuring safe measures continue to be taken for the campus. Our goal has always been to ensure the safety of all on campus. We are confident that the decision made to augment the mask mandate is supported by the data, external guidance/collaboration, a comprehensive testing program and the willingness to pivot if required. This approach will allow a successful step to return to some normalcy without a significant increase in risk. If you have any questions, you may reach me at 716-614-6240.
