

Wellness Center News:

What You Need to Know About Monkeypox

Niagara County Community College has been monitoring the Monkeypox situation carefully for the past several weeks, and continue to do so. The risk to the NCCC community is low and though the numbers of Monkeypox have decreased, it is still important to be educated about this virus.

Monkeypox is most often associated with a rash that can appear anywhere on the body including the face, feet, hands, genitals, and inside the mouth. Symptoms can also include fever, headaches, and inside the mouth.


According to the CDC, human-to-human transmission of monkeypox virus occurs by direct contact with lesions or infected body fluids, or from exposure to respiratory secretions during prolonged face-to-face contact. A person is considered to be infectious until there is full healing of the rash with formation of a fresh layer of skin. This can take several weeks. Researchers are still trying to understand if the virus can spread from someone who has no symptoms.

To decrease the risk of infection students, employees, and visitors need to wash their hands regularly for at least 20 seconds, avoid contact with individuals who appear to be sick, and contact their physician or the Wellness Center if they have a new or unexplained rash or other symptoms. These practices should be a part of our normal daily routine. *Remember: Monkeypox is rare*. In any case, prompt medical care is important for your well-being and to protect others no matter what the cause of your symptoms.

It is characterized by the following symptoms:




