

As NCCC heads into its sixtieth anniversary, this series will focus on college in the movies. We have comedy, drama, and documentaries to explore what college means, what it is for, and what students hope to get out of it.

### The Freshman

(Newmeyer and Taylor, 1925)

Genius comic actor Harold Lloyd creates the celluloid pattern for young American men in Hollywood movies—from National Lampoon's Animal House to Van Wilder—who go to college for multiple reasons, none of which are academic. Comic hijinks ensue when Lloyd's college freshman tangles with the dean and the campus bully while striving to be the big man on campus and while looking for a sweetheart. We'll discuss some of the historical and cinematic truths, misconceptions, and stereotypes about college in the follow-up discussion.

### Kid Icarus —

Tuesday, October, 18, 12:30-1:45pm, Arts and Media Theater | Presented by Ian Stapley As a freshman film student at a community college, Leigh Harkrider has a life goal: to be a film director as famous as Steven Spielberg. Harkrider has no experience making a movie, but his ignorance includes the history of film, the role of a director, the way a film crew works, and people skills. Despite numerous setbacks, Harkrider perseveres, learning a few things about being a director and about being a better person. The documentary suggests that mistakes in pursuit of a goal are inevitable and that persistence contributes mightily to ability. NOTE: Profanity abounds.

## **Ivory Tower**

Is college worth the cost? After learning that student loan debt had soared past one trillion dollars, documentary filmmaker Andrew Rossi decided to investigate whether higher education is worth the towering tuition charges. Ivory Tower explores the current education crisis from the hallowed halls of Harvard, to community colleges, to online learning, giving viewers a sobering look at the state of higher education in America. After the screening, we'll discuss audience views and opinions, talk about efforts to cancel student debt, and consider the politicization of education in America and where candidates stand ahead of Election Day.

## Mona Lisa Smile

Women may outnumber men in college today, but this is a recent development. In this lushly shot ensemble film starring Julia Roberts and directed by Mike Newell (Four Weddings and a Funeral, Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire), privileged women at a liberal arts college in the 1950s struggle with their places in society, the reasons why women pursue college, and their difficulties balancing their lives. Come for the first-rate cast and art direction; stay for the hauntingly still-relevant issues facing women today.
