Need to Order an Official Transcript? Place your order online through Banner Web:

- · Click on the Student Records tab
- Click on Academic Transcript Order Official or
- Go to the Registration & Records webpage and click on the "Order Official Transcripts" button.

There is a \$10 fee for each official transcript ordered.

Please note: Unofficial transcripts are free of charge and may be obtained by logging into Banner Web; click on the Student Records tab; choose Academic Transcripts – View Unofficial.

Use Myhub for free enrollment verifications!

Myhub is a free and secure online application provided by the National Student Clearinghouse. Myhub provides you with access to your verified education record from Niagara County Community College and all other colleges and universities that participate in Myhub where you also have an academic record.

Myhub offers many convenient self-service features, such as:

- · Download and print enrollment, advanced registration, and "good student discount" certificates
- · Order transcripts
- · Add digital credentials hosted on Credly to your Myhub learner record

Through Myhub, you have lifetime access to your complete academic record of enrollment and degrees earned from participating institutions. You'll also benefit from immediate access to new capabilities and resources, which will serve you throughout your professional life, as they are added to Myhub. 

NCCC instructor, filmmaker, and public media producer Scott Sackett will lead a discussion of this riveting documentary film starring Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Ava DuVernay, Spike Lee, and others who recognize the legacy of photo journalist-turned-movie director Gordon Parks. Chances are, you have seen some of Parks's famous images from Life magazine without knowing the full story of this artist and social activist whose work broke barriers and portrayed common folk with dignity.

The modifier "epic" is used so often that its meaning has been diluted, but Cloud Atlas is an epic film whose expansiveness required three directors and that demands the largest screen available. Based on the novel by David Mitchell, Tykwer (Run Lola Run) and the Wachowskis (The Matrix) interweave six separate storylines from different genres (including SF, thriller, and comedy), spanning hundreds of years and multiple continents to pay tribute to the ways that human beings stand up for truth and dignity when opposed by forces both large and small.

Secret Path -

Between the 1880s and 1996, the Canadian government forcibly removed thousands of Indigenous children from their families. The children were sent to far away Residential Schools with the purpose of erasing their culture, heritage, and language. The abuse the Residential schools inflicted on these children is a national shame. Gord Downie's animated film Secret Path tells the story of one of these children, Chanie Wenjack, who fled the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School to return to his family, nearly four hundred miles away. He died en route. He was twelve years old.
