Public Comments:

- Chief Ross Annable:
 - Introducing lockdown drill:
 - Will send out emails/alerts
 - Will be an advertised date during the month of November
 - Wants to gauge the response, especially near common area
 - Will be same alert for fire drill
 - Will send NCCC alerts
 - For G244 and G243, allow some time for students to drift in if reasonable
 - Public safety will try to guide students from common areas in the nearby rooms
 - Chief Ross has been to every office to make sure they each have a plan
 - Everyone needs to be aware of their area so they can have a plan of action
 - Handouts:
 - How to respond Run, Hide, Fight
 - Can run away if reasonable
 - Hide if there is no option to run
 - Fight as a last resort
 - Heather Trumble:
 - What do we do about the wide-open windows in offices; could we get blackout shades?
 - Chief Ross:
 - Will discuss the option to order something like blackout shades. Until then, there are ways to improvise.
 - Tonia Fingerlow:
 - What about the Dining Services staff and the seating area?

- Chief Ross Annable:
 - It may take too much time to close all the doors in the dining commons
 - Try to get the push button locks in the offices if doors do not have them

o Bob McKeown:

 For the all-glass gaming lab, Jason has the keys for some of the rooms across the hall

Chief Ross Annable:

- The drill will last about 10 minutes since no one is leaving the building.
- There will be drills for the NFCI campus as well as in the housing village.
- Tonia Fingerlow and Steve Hoover (Dining Services):
 - Steve Hoover:
 - States they are here to listen to feedback from students and use it to make improvements.
 - Jozlyn Fiorito:
 - Has an issue with buying drinks through dining services with the meal plan.
 - Steve Hoover:
 - Meal swipe working as advertised a fountain drink, entrée, and side
 - This is something that is not new, but it has not been enforced in the past.
 - Can work with the cashiers on a solution

Matteo Williams:

- I could not get two sides and a drink with my meal swipe.
- The dollar amount limit works better.
- Steve Hoover:
 - We could work something out regarding that, but we make too much of a profit for that.
 - Students aren't spending as much as they could with their meal swipes; wants it to be fair for the students.
 - Willing to talk with their manager about going with the threshold, if students are willing to lose out on some of their money

Hisan Milanes

- Their biggest concern with Dining Services is with cashiers
- Suggests that cashiers should check student IDs at checkout
- Steve Hoover:
 - Agrees that cashiers should be checking the IDs used at checkout, so no one uses meal swipes that do not belong to them.
 - If anyone gets a new ID, they should immediately speak with the College Association.
 - Perhaps we can bring this up in orientation going forward.

- Suggests that we have a session for learning about the student ID and the meal swipes during orientation, so no student gets confused – this would make the process smoother.
- Heather Trumble:
 - Suggests the addition of a sign being posted up that explains the basics of the student ID.
- Steve Hoover:
 - We are aware that some cashiers suggest there is a limit on dining dollars and have begun to educate them on the rules.
 - Speak directly with Tonia Fingerlow regarding any issues, and if she is not here, look for Steve Hoover.

Steve Hoover:

- Opens the floor to any other discussion
 - Hisan Milanes:
 - Suggests the implementation of more dishes to be added to the rotation
 - Jozlyn Fiorito:
 - Suggests that prices are lowered provides example of 3 strips of bacon that costs \$4
 - Steve Hoover:
 - There is an increase in expenses for the food that is used
 - Open to working with the students if there is a menu item that costs too much – it's all about the cost of direct materials, labor, and overhead
 - Wants to put the entire menu on the website for transparency
 - Currently losing money through dining commons most money is being made by catering
 - Attempting to rebuild relationships to cater to more events such as graduation.
 - Bob McKeown
 - Has a lot of experience with NCCC and the College Association is currently the most transparent it has ever been
 - Andrew Binks:
 - o Brings up the inconsistency with the French fries
 - Tonia Fingerlow:
 - It is due to supply and demand.
 - Steve Hoover:
 - There may be impactful changes made by next semester.
