Important Spring Deadline

The deadline to request an S/U/W Grade or withdraw from the College is **Monday, April 17**.

- **Withdraw from a Class** – To drop a course and receive a W (withdrawal) grade as a final grade, complete the electronic [Drop or Withdraw from a Course](#) form.
- **Withdraw from College (All Classes)** – To withdraw online from the college and receive “X” grades for **ALL** of your current courses, complete the electronic [Request for College Withdrawal \(All Classes\)](#) form. If you completed any modular courses, you will receive the grade earned and “W” grades will be applied to all other college coursework.
- **Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory (S/U) Grades** – To elect to receive a final grade of S/U in a course, students must submit the electronic [S/U grade request](#) form which will also require approvals from the course instructor and the student’s advisor. Selecting the S/U option may be beneficial to students in certain circumstances; however, students should be aware of the impact on course loads in future semesters, financial aid/academic standing implications, and the transferability of S/U grades.

Keynote Speaker Dr. Fabio Escobar Presents

**Sapere Aude: The Role of Expertise
in Human Debate**

One of the perennial concerns of philosophy is the definition of reality. As philosophers investigate its nature or structure they quickly run into concerns of an epistemological nature. That is, philosophers not only want to know what reality is, we also want to know how we know what reality is. One way to work through this is by checking to see if those statements "correspond" to reality. The formal check of whether a statement is "true" or "false" in such a model depends on the proper correspondence between what we say, think, or believe and what reality "really" is. When we set out to measure this alignment, furthermore, we sometimes rely on other individuals

who may have insight into the topic; experts. This shortcut to knowledge relies on trust and on a simple intellectual division of labor: we can't all be experts at everything, after all.

But what happens when that trust disappears and the division of labor is not respected? What does a conversation look like that rejects expertise? What do we do when no agreement or common ground is possible or desired?

This presentation will assess the role of trust in expertise from an epistemological perspective, drawing on some classic debates in the history of philosophy as well as some recent debates in social networks.

About Dr. Fabio Escobar

Dr. Fabio Escobar has a B.A. in Political Science and Philosophy from California State University and a Ph.D. in Philosophy from the University at Buffalo. In 2015 he received the SUNY Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Professional Service and in 2014 he received the Erie Community College Student Government Association Faculty Appreciation Award. He has also served on hospital ethics committees and institutional review boards.

His philosophical research focuses on metaphysics and the structure of human experience, a field traditionally known as phenomenology and which serves as a foundation for arguments about the structure of reality. His overall goal is to develop a comprehensive metaphysical model that transparently and systematically assesses human bias. His work closely tracks developments in critical theory, otherwise known as the Frankfurt School of Philosophical Research.
