## Enrollment Center:

### Important Spring Deadline

The deadline to request an S/U/W Grade or withdraw from the College is **TODAY...Monday, April 17.**

- **Withdraw from a Class** – To drop a course and receive a W (withdrawal) grade as a final grade, complete the electronic [Drop or Withdraw from a Course](#) form.
- **Withdraw from College (All Classes)** – To withdraw online from the college and receive “X” grades for **ALL** of your current courses, complete the electronic [Request for College Withdrawal \(All Classes\)](#) form. If you completed any modular courses, you will receive the grade earned and “W” grades will be applied to all other college coursework.
- **Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory (S/U) Grades** – To elect to receive a final grade of S/U in a course, students must submit the electronic [S/U grade request](#) form which will also require approvals from the course instructor and the student’s advisor. Selecting the S/U option may be beneficial to students in certain circumstances; however, students should be aware of the impact on course loads in future semesters, financial aid/academic standing implications, and the transferability of S/U grades.

- Apply through Banner Web:
  - Click on “Student Records”
  - Click on “Apply for Graduation”
  - Select the major you are applying for. If you do not see your major listed, please contact the Enrollment Center at 716-614-6250.
  - Verify how your name should appear on your diploma.
  - Review the information you entered is correct and click “Submit Request”
  - You can view your submitted application under the Student Records tab of Banner Web at any time.

**April 1<sup>st</sup> : Financial Aid On-Time Deadline** - All students should file a FAFSA by this date to secure funds for Fall classes. Don't delay! Applications filed after this date may not show up as processed aid on your bill.



**April 3<sup>rd</sup> : Fall Registration for READMIT Students** - Fall registration begins for ReAdmit (Returning) students. Visit <https://www.niagaracc.suny.edu/accepted/> for more information.



**April 7<sup>th</sup> : Good Friday** - College Closed. No classes.



**April 10<sup>th</sup> : Fall Registration for Non-Matriculated Students** - Fall registration begins for non-degree seeking (non-matriculated) students. Visit <https://www.niagaracc.suny.edu/registration-records/register/> for more information.

**April 10<sup>th</sup> : Fall Registration for New & Transfer Students** - Fall registration begins for New and Transfer students. Visit <https://www.niagaracc.suny.edu/accepted/> for more information.



**April 17<sup>th</sup> : Deadline for Spring S/U (satisfactory/unsatisfactory) or W (withdrawal) Grades** - *Modular courses differ in deadlines; see Modular Class Dates tab at <https://www.niagaracc.suny.edu/registration-records/studentcalendar/> for more information.* Decision Day! Should a course be dropped to get a "W" grade or is the course salvageable? See your instructor. Don't wait until the last day! Dropping a course may negatively affect progress toward your degree – talk with your advisor. Dropping a course may also affect your eligibility for Financial Aid – speak to someone in the Financial Aid Office. Contact the Student Success Center at 716-614-6290 or Enrollment Center at 716-614-6250.

**April 17<sup>th</sup> : Last day to withdraw from ALL Spring classes** - X grades on transcript (*modular courses differ in deadlines; see Modular Class Dates tab at <https://www.niagaracc.suny.edu/registration-records/studentcalendar/> for more information*). Withdrawing from all classes results in "X" grades and may affect your Financial Aid and academic standing. Contact the Student Success Center at 716-614-6290 or Enrollment Center at 716-614-6250. You may withdraw from the College online through the Withdrawal Form found in BannerWeb.



**April 28<sup>th</sup> : Graduation Application Deadline** - Log into BannerWeb. Under "Student Records" select "Apply for Graduation". You cannot graduate without completing this application! If you are earning a degree and a certificate or more than one degree, be sure to apply for BOTH!!

**Help Spread the Word About the End of SUNY's COVID Vaccine Mandate**

As announced earlier this week, SUNY Chancellor King has lifted the requirement for students to be vaccinated against COVID. Although the college has shared this news with students already, it is worth repeating. Key points include:

- The vaccine mandate expires with the start of summer courses;
- SUNY's decision came as the result of a recommendation from a panel of health experts;
- The vast majority of SUNY students are vaccinated; and
- SUNY will continue to monitor COVID data and update related policies as needed.
