Wellness Center News:

The following information contains the updated recommendations/guidelines from the CDC and the NYS DOH regarding when to stay home and when to go back to normal activities after respiratory illnesses including COVID-19 and Influenza.

- Individuals should stay home and away from others, including people they live with who are not sick, if they have respiratory virus symptoms that are not better explained by another cause. These symptoms can include fever, chills, fatigue, cough, runny nose, and headache.

- Individuals can go back to normal activities when, for at least 24 hours, both of the following are true:
 - o Symptoms are getting better overall, and
 - o They no longer have a fever without the use of fever-reducing medication.

- When going back to normal activities, individuals should take added precautions over the next 5 days, including taking additional [steps for cleaner air](#), [hygiene](#), [masks](#), [physical distancing](#), and [testing](#) when they will be around other people, especially older adults, young children, and those with weakened immune systems.

- Keep in mind that people may still be able to spread the virus that made them sick, even if they are feeling better, so it is important to take extra precautions after resuming normal activities.

- If individuals develop a fever or start to feel worse, they should stay home and away from others again. They should use the same criteria for returning to normal activities as when they first had symptoms and take added precautions over the next 5 days.

- If you earned \$79,000 or less in 2023, you qualify.
- Use on-site computers, or your own laptop or tablet
- You only need basic computer skills and an active email account.
- Safe and secure online tax software.
- Bring your 2023 tax documents and a copy of your 2022 tax returns (if you filed).

Commencement...

Is the ceremony celebrating your graduation. Diplomas are not distributed at Commencement.

Graduation...

If you meet all academic requirements, you will find the status of your graduation at the top of your Degree Works evaluation. Simply log into Degree Works and look at the header information. Certified graduates will indicate an awarded degree status, along with the term of graduation. Evaluations will take place through early June, so please continue to check your status here. If you do not meet graduation requirements, you will receive a letter and a T-Wolves email denying graduation. You can expect to receive these notifications by the **middle of June**.

Diplomas...

Digital Diplomas will be issued which are fast, free, and sharable. The digital diploma will be emailed to you but does not replace the paper diploma. A paper diploma will be mailed to the graduate's address on file approximately 3 weeks after the digital diplomas are issued. Graduates should expect email and text notification to claim their diploma.

Each graduate will receive two tickets to the commencement ceremony

What time do I have to arrive on campus on Commencement Day?

Graduates are expected to arrive by 9:00 a.m. in the Arts & Media Theatre to line up for the ceremony.

No Smoking

There will be **NO SMOKING** on campus. NCCC is a tobacco-free environment.

Parking on campus

Guests for the ceremony can park in lot 1, which is located off Saunders Settlement Road (Route 31).

Names in Program Book

NCCC makes every effort to include all degree candidates' names in the Commencement program. Those who apply for Graduation after the deadline (April 29th) are not guaranteed listing in the program.

Children Require Tickets

Room capacity is based on individuals. All guests entering the Main Gym must present a guest ticket, including babies and children, even if they will sit on adult laps or in strollers.

Important Dates

May 1st Last day to order a Cap & Gown and still participate in the Commencement ceremony.

May 6th Deadline for graduating students or guests who are physically challenged and require special arrangements at the ceremony to contact Jill Faddoul, Commencement Coordinator at jmfaddoul@niagaracc.suny.edu or (716) 614-5974.

May 2nd - May 10th Students who have filed for graduation and have purchased a cap and gown can pick up their 2 (two) guest tickets at the Barnes and Noble Bookstore. (The location where you purchased your cap & gown: Sanborn or NFCI)

Wolf Packed Program Perception Survey #2 coming to you on Tuesday, 3/19 – You can take it on your cell phone or through Brightspace

The Wolf Packed program that you use to secure your books and course materials each semester was first implemented at SUNY Niagara in Fall 2023 (last semester). Since then, the College has been trying to assess the impact of the program on their students to improve the program quality. As part of this effort, we conducted our first student survey last semester. We are conducting a second survey this semester, **starting on Tuesday, March 19.**

The survey will be delivered to you from the external research company, Hanover Research, and this time, all current students (who are 18 years old or older) will receive a text message including a QR code, which will also be available through your Brightspace main page.

The survey will be open for you for approximately two weeks. As a token of appreciation, **you will have a chance to enter into a random drawing for one of four gift cards of \$100 each when you complete the survey.**

Even if you participated in the first survey last semester, please still consider taking this second survey, as it is designed to compare your experience with the program last semester vs. this semester and to measure the progress of the program.
