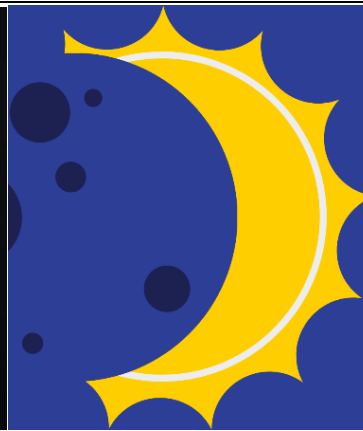

## IMPORTANT SPRING DEADLINE:

The deadline to request an S/U/W Grade or Withdraw from the College is **Friday, April 19**.

- **Withdraw from a Class** – To drop a course and receive a W (withdrawal) grade as a final grade, complete the electronic [Drop or Withdraw from a Course](#) form.
- **Withdraw from College (All Classes)** – To withdraw online from the college and receive “X” grades for **ALL** of your current courses, complete the electronic [Request for College Withdrawal \(All Classes\)](#) form. If you completed any modular courses, you will receive the grade earned, and “W” grades will be applied to all other college coursework.
- **Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory (S/U) Grades** – To elect to receive a final grade of S/U in a course, students must submit the electronic [S/U grade request](#) form which will also require approvals from the course instructor and the student's advisor. Selecting the S/U option may be beneficial to students in certain circumstances; however, students should be aware of the impact on course loads in future semesters, financial aid/academic standing implications, and the transferability of S/U grades.

**The deadline to file for Spring graduation is April 28<sup>th</sup>. If you plan to earn more than one degree and/or certificate in the spring semester, please submit a graduation application for both.**

- Apply through Banner Web:
  - Click on “Student Records”
  - Click on “Apply for Graduation”
  - Select the major you are applying for. If you do not see your major listed, please contact the Enrollment Center at 716-614-6250.
  - Verify how your name should appear on your diploma.
  - Review the information you entered is correct and click “Submit Request”
  - You can view your submitted application under the Student Records tab of Banner Web at any time.
  - If your mailing address has changed, please update the Personal Information tab of Banner Web. Your diploma will be mailed to your mailing address on file.

### Commencement:

Is the ceremony celebrating your graduation. Diplomas are not distributed at Commencement.

### Graduation:

If you meet all academic requirements, you will find the status of your graduation at the top of your Degree Works evaluation. Simply log into Degree Works and look at the header information. Certified graduates will indicate an awarded degree status, along with the term of graduation. Evaluations will take place through early June, so please continue to check your status here. If you do not meet graduation requirements, you will receive a letter and a T-Wolves email denying graduation. You can expect to receive these notifications by the **middle of June**.

### Diplomas:

Digital Diplomas will be issued which are fast, free, and sharable. The digital diploma will be emailed to you but does not replace the paper diploma. A paper diploma will be mailed to the graduate's address on file approximately 3 weeks after the digital diplomas are issued. Graduates should expect email and text notification to claim their diploma.

**Each graduate will receive two tickets to the commencement ceremony**

### What time do I have to arrive on campus on Commencement Day?

**Graduates are expected to arrive by 9:00 a.m. in the Arts & Media Theatre to line up for the ceremony.**

**No Smoking:** There will be **NO SMOKING** on campus. NCCC is a tobacco-free environment.

**Parking on campus:** Guests for the ceremony can park in lot 1, which is located off Saunders Settlement Road (Route 31).

### Names in Program Book

NCCC makes every effort to include all degree candidates' names in the Commencement program. Those who apply for Graduation after the deadline (April 29th) are not guaranteed listing in the program.

### Children Require Tickets

Room capacity is based on individuals. All guests entering the Main Gym must present a guest ticket, including babies and children, even if they will sit on adult laps or in strollers.

This spring, the NCCinephiles brings you three movies that celebrate the imagination in different ways. If a filmmaker can dream it, then so can you.

**The Iron Giant (Brad Bird, 1999)**

This directorial debut, from animation legend Brad Bird, who would go on to direct such blockbusters such as Pixar's The Incredibles and Ratatouille, tells the story of a young boy and the sleepy fictional town of Rockwell, Maine, who are suddenly jarred by the visit of a mysterious stranger during the height and tension of the Cold War in 1957. Although initially a box office flop for Warner Brothers Studios, this critically acclaimed film, based on the 1966 British novel The Iron Man by Ted Hughes, has gone on to become a cult classic and one of the most highly praised animated films of all time!

Working closely with the incomparable Tilda Swinton (The Chronicles of Narnia, Snowpiercer, Doctor Strange) Sally Potter adapted Virginia Woolf's epic fantasy about a Renaissance man who lives for hundreds of years, waking up after a long nap to find that he is now a woman. Few epic films in the twentieth century address gender and art so frankly, yet the highlights involve the balance of wit and wisdom and the noteworthy filming on a budget that bear comparison to the effects in Citizen Kane.

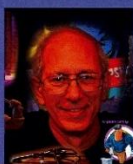

**Financial Aid On-Time Deadline** - Students should file a FAFSA by this date to secure funds for Fall. Applications filed after may not show up as processed aid on your bill.

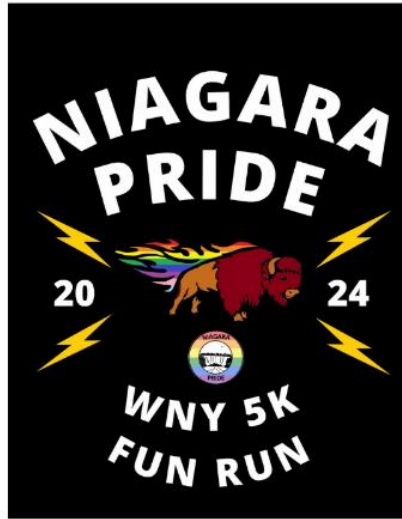
